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Message from our Chair and Chief Executive Officer

To our community here in Jersey,

Thank you. Whether you supported us through a donation, volunteered your time, joined an event, referred someone to our services, or simply shared our name—you've helped make a difference in the lives of hundreds of islanders affected by cancer.

In 2024, Macmillan Cancer Support Jersey stood alongside more people than ever before. We saw a 50% rise in visits to our centre, supported 310 people through our cancer pathway service (ICJJ), and created 137 personalised care plans. These are not just numbers—they represent real people in our community who felt heard, supported, and less alone during some of the most difficult moments of their lives.

This past year, we've focused on making sure our doors—and our services—are open to everyone. We introduced translated resources in Portuguese and Polish, made our information easier to understand, and worked closely with other charities and health professionals to break down barriers to access. We were proud to see a significant rise in engagement from people of different ethnic backgrounds, men, and underserved groups. When we say we're here for everyone affected by cancer in Jersey, we mean it—and we're making real progress.

Of course, 2024 brought challenges too. With no cycle challenge, our overall income dropped. But in true Jersey spirit, we adapted. We launched new events, strengthened our community partnerships, and introduced new digital tools that helped us raise more online than ever before. Our new White Collar DJ event raised over £27,000, and the impact of corporate partnerships grew thanks to the efforts of our expanded fundraising team.

As we entered 2025, the demand for our services has only increased. In just the first three months of this year, counselling sessions grew by 335%, and referrals more than doubled compared to the same period last year. This tells us two things: more people know we're here, and more people need us. And we are rising to meet that need—by expanding our volunteer team, hiring a new Service Lead, and continuing to build partnerships that help us do more, together.

At Macmillan Jersey, we believe that no one should face cancer alone. Every conversation we have, every care plan we create, every event we run is made possible by people like you—our community. You make the work we do matter.

Thank you for helping us show up for the people of Jersey—today, tomorrow, and in the years to come.

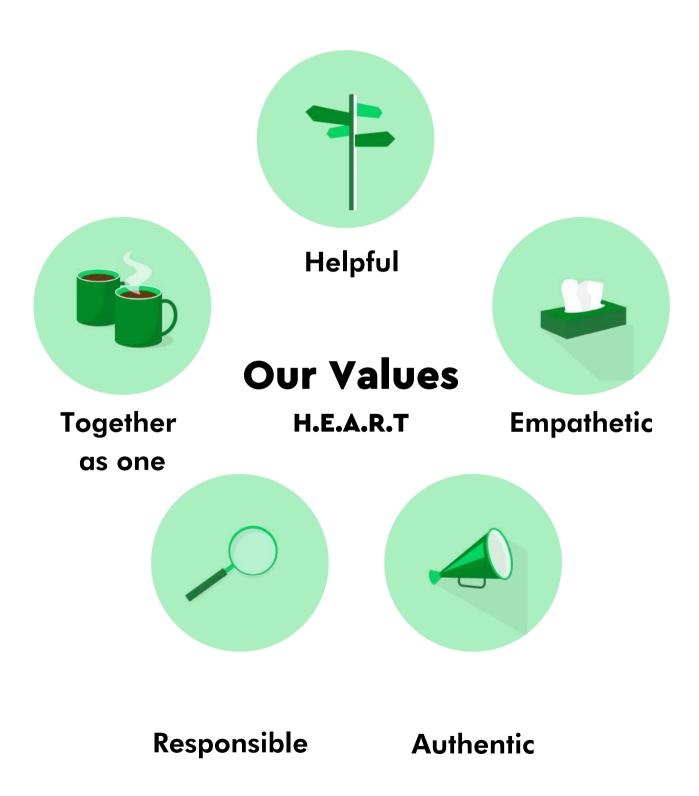

Service User story

Sometime in 2023, I noticed an unusual wart or mole on my right knee. I thought it was an age spot—something harmless—and didn't give it much thought. It wasn't until a routine GP appointment that I mentioned it. I was referred to Dermatology at Jersey Hospital, where they weren't sure what it was either, but advised it should be removed. The word melanoma was mentioned. That's when the anxiety began.

Less than three weeks later, it was removed. The moment I knew things were serious was when I got the call saying the consultant wanted to see me the next day. More anxiety. At that appointment, I was told it was melanoma, and that further surgery would be needed in Southampton to remove wider margins and some lymph nodes to check if the cancer had spread.

The hardest part of this journey has been the waiting—waiting for appointments, waiting for results. My surgery in Southampton was on the 9th July 2024, and just a few weeks later, I was told that melanoma had been found in one of the lymph nodes. I would need to start a 12-month course of immunotherapy.

Macmillan were there for me at every stage. I'd done some fundraising for them in the past and knew some of the incredible team, but their support during this time went beyond anything I expected. Their expertise, compassion, and reassurance made a huge difference.

One of my biggest fears was the sun. I became extremely anxious and had a couple of sessions with Kate at Macmillan, who helped me understand my anxiety and taught me that I could still enjoy being outdoors—with the right precautions. That support was vital.

Now, 9 months into treatment and with three clear scans, I still have moments of anxiety. But I know I can pop into Macmillan, be heard, understood, and supported. That has been key to helping me through this journey.

The Oasis is Macmillan Jersey's Cancer Support and Wellbeing Centre. The support services offered at The Oasis are:

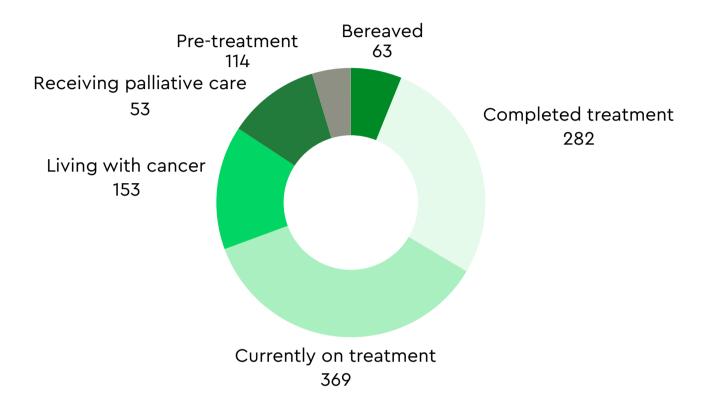
- Drop in centre to chat with one of our emotional support team

- Library of Practical Information
- Complementary Therapies (Massage, Reflexology)
- Wellbeing Talks
- Wellbeing classes (Tai Chi, Pilates, Yoga)
- Support groups (Prostate cancer support group, HOPE support)
- Social Sessions (Coffee Mornings, Allotment)
- Home to our Improving the Cancer Journey Jersey team offering Holistic Needs Assessments)

To ensure the best possible environment to deliver our services, The Oasis is audited every three years by Macmillan UK for our Macmillan Quality Environment Award; which looks at the space we deliver our services in against strict criteria. Currently we hold a rating of five, which is the highest quality environment mark awarded.

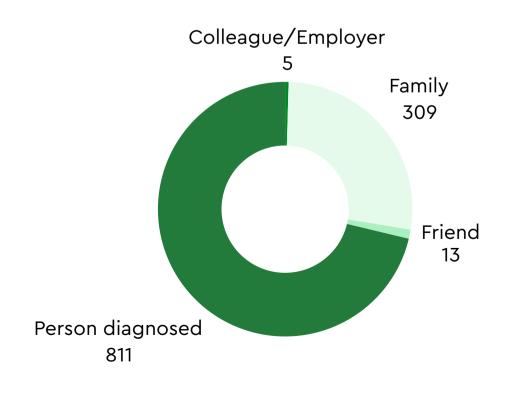


The Oasis in numbers

Improving the Cancer Journey Jersey (ICJJ)

After two years of planning, Macmillan Jersey was delighted to officially partner with Health and Community Services offering our new service Improving the Cancer Journey Jersey (ICJJ). This service forms one of the key deliverables within the Island Wide Cancer Strategy launched in 2023. This service also introduced a collaboration between Macmillan Jersey, GP practices and other related cancer support organisations.

ICJJ forms part of the cancer pathway with all newly diagnosed patients being referred from Health to our cancer support worker to be offered a Holistic Needs Assessment within the community. Following this assessment, an individualised care plan is created and shared with Health and Community Services and GPs.

We are extremely grateful to the Barry Burns Foundation for funding the service for the next three years. In addition to this funding, ABC Jersey funded a breast specific cancer support worker and AFM renovated our existing space to make a separate unit for the ICJJ team.

We look forward to being able to support all islanders diagnosed with cancer in the years to come.

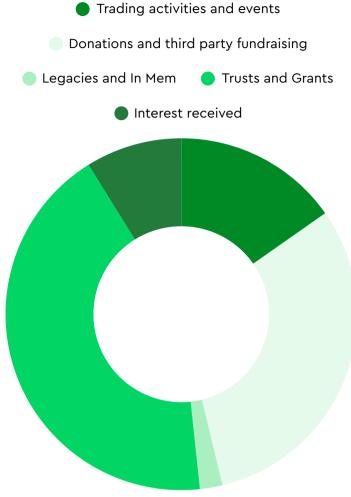

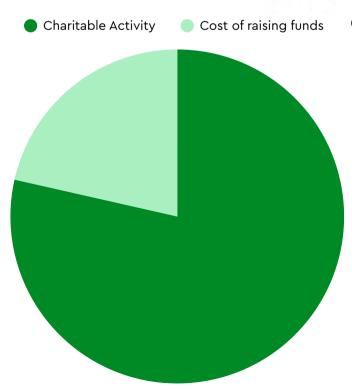
